PREFACE

Progressive Exercises was first issued in 1899. It was revised in 1902 and again in 1916. Its popularity as a convenient, economical, and accurate testing book has made it an inseparable companion to the Gregg Shorthand Manual.

The Anniversary Edition is a complete revision. Each of its thirty-six exercises is a thorough objective test of the principles presented in the correspondingly numbered unit in the Anniversary Edition of the Shorthand Manual. The material composing the exercises is new and contains a large percentage of business words and phrases of high frequency, supplementing, but not duplicating, the vocabulary of the new Manual unless the nature of the test made it desirable to do so. The words were chosen mainly from the fourth and fifth thousand words of high frequency (the Horn Study). The phrases were selected from the Hoke list of 500 commonly used business phrases.

The size of the book has been changed to conform to the size of the Manual. The standard-width column and line of the Gregg Shorthand notebook are used for the first time in this edition of Progressive Exercises. Teachers will welcome this standardization as an effective aid in securing more accurate proportion.

The tests have been printed on both sides of the paper, thus giving the student thirty-six instead of twenty exercises without increasing the cost of the book.

Unit by unit, as these exercises are completed, the teacher has before him a dependable diagnosis of the work of each of his students. Intelligent interpretation of the results of this testing in the form of helpful remedial teaching should follow immediately. The major value of testing is lost if the results are used solely to determine grades.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE TEACHER

Each of the thirty-six exercises consists of three parts:

- 1. A list of words and phrases, to test the student's knowledge of the principles.
- 2. Connected matter written in shorthand, to test the student's reading or transcribing ability.
- 3. Connected matter set in type, to test his shorthand-writing ability.

The teacher who is using the individual method of instruction will welcome the simplicity of Progressive Exercises. Upon completion of a unit in the Shorthand Manual the student may be given Progressive Exercises, and without directions or supervision he will be able to test his progress quickly and thoroughly.

An optional method of procedure, growing in favor with teachers of large classes, is to dictate the first and third parts of each exercise at an average rate of speed. This method of testing has in its favor the fact that the conditions under which the student takes the test approach the practical conditions under which stenographers work. The teacher will, of course, use whichever method is best suited to his needs.

All three parts of each exercise can be completed easily in thirty minutes. A teacher's key in the form of an exact duplicate of the exercise correctly filled in enables the teacher to make corrections rapidly, at his convenience. Those teachers having a fifty-minute period at their disposal may find it desirable to use the remainder of the period for the correction of the exercise by the students. If this method is used, the aid of the blackboard should not be overlooked. It will take but a few minutes to place the key to an exercise on the board to guide the students in correcting the outlines.

Progressive Exercises in bound form, neatly filled out and graded, furnishes a convincing and attractive exhibit of each student's progress and of the teacher's scientific method of testing that progress. Any teacher, however, who prefers to use the exercises in loose-leaf form may obtain them printed separately.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE STUDENT

Shorthand outlines are of little value to you unless you can form them readily. In taking these tests, therefore, remember that their value in measuring your skill will be increased if you write each outline at as rapid a rate as is consistent with accuracy.

Unless your teacher permits you to do otherwise, do not change an outline when it is once written, and do not write it more than once.

After an exercise has been corrected, practice each corrected outline in your notebook five times.

The wide margins have been left purposely for the teacher's use in making corrections. Therefore, do not let your writing extend beyond the printed lines.







PREFACE

Progressive Exercises was first issued in 1899. It was revised in 1902 and again in 1916. Its popularity as a convenient, economical, and accurate testing book has made it an inseparable companion to the Gregg Shorthand Manual.

The Anniversary Edition is a complete revision. Each of its thirty-six exercises is a thorough objective test of the principles presented in the correspondingly numbered unit in the Anniversary Edition of the Shorthand Manual. The material composing the exercises is new and contains a large percentage of business words and phrases of high frequency, supplementing, but not duplicating, the vocabulary of the new Manual unless the nature of the test made it desirable to do so. The words were chosen mainly from the fourth and fifth thousand words of high frequency (the Horn Study). The phrases were selected from the Hoke list of 500 commonly used business phrases.

The size of the book has been changed to conform to the size of the Manual. The standard-width column and line of the Gregg Shorthand notebook are used for the first time in this edition of Progressive Exercises. Teachers will welcome this standardization as an effective aid in securing more accurate proportion.

The tests have been printed on both sides of the paper, thus giving the student thirty-six instead of twenty exercises without increasing the cost of the book.

Unit by unit, as these exercises are completed, the teacher has before him a dependable diagnosis of the work of each of his students. Intelligent interpretation of the results of this testing in the form of helpful remedial teaching should follow immediately. The major value of testing is lost if the results are used solely to determine grades.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE TEACHER

Each of the thirty-six exercises consists of three parts:

- 1. A list of words and phrases, to test the student's knowledge of the principles.
- 2. Connected matter written in shorthand, to test the student's reading or transcribing ability.
- 3. Connected matter set in type, to test his shorthand-writing ability.

The teacher who is using the individual method of instruction will welcome the simplicity of Progressive Exercises. Upon completion of a unit in the Shorthand Manual the student may be given Progressive Exercises, and without directions or supervision he will be able to test his progress quickly and thoroughly.

An optional method of procedure, growing in favor with teachers of large classes, is to dictate the first and third parts of each exercise at an average rate of speed. This method of testing has in its favor the fact that the conditions under which the student takes the test approach the practical conditions under which stenographers work. The teacher will, of course, use whichever method is best suited to his needs.

All three parts of each exercise can be completed easily in thirty minutes. A teacher's key in the form of an exact duplicate of the exercise correctly filled in enables the teacher to make corrections rapidly, at his convenience. Those teachers having a fifty-minute period at their disposal may find it desirable to use the remainder of the period for the correction of the exercise by the students. If this method is used, the aid of the blackboard should not be overlooked. It will take but a few minutes to place the key to an exercise on the board to guide the students in correcting the outlines.

Progressive Exercises in bound form, neatly filled out and graded, furnishes a convincing and attractive exhibit of each student's progress and of the teacher's scientific method of testing that progress. Any teacher, however, who prefers to use the exercises in loose-leaf form may obtain them printed separately.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE STUDENT

Shorthand outlines are of little value to you unless you can form them readily. In taking these tests, therefore, remember that their value in measuring your skill will be increased if you write each outline at as rapid a rate as is consistent with accuracy.


Unless your teacher permits you to do otherwise, do not change an outline when it is once written, and do not write it more than once.
